A Few Nagging Items

Garbage Pickup

Garbage is picked up every Tuesday. Please package your garbage properly. Use bags and garbage cans, and keep the weight of filled cans to a maximum of 75 pounds each. The Village does not pickup heavy or bulky objects, old furniture, metal, or any kind of toxic waste. Residents should arrange to take these items to the landfill themselves.

Recycle

Save a tree. Recycle your cardboard, paper, magazines and newspapers at the recycling shed beside the Village office. Please flatten cardboard and bundle your items.

Snow Removal

Now that winter is here, help us keep the streets clear. If you park on the street, make sure that you leave room for the snowplow to work. Please don't obstruct the alleys. And remember that residents are responsible for keeping adjacent sidewalks clear.

Snowmobile Season

Winter means it's snowmobile season. Have fun, but remember your responsibilities.

You are only allowed to ride your snowmobile from where it is normally stored to outside the Village, and you must:

- 1) Use the alleys as much as possible.
- 2) Take the shortest route in and out of the village
- 3) Travel at a maximum speed of 16 km/h (10 mph).

Meter Readings

Water meter readings are due at the end of December.

Read your meter in the last week of December or the first week of January. Write it on your bill or call it in to the office by January 7th, 2008.

Utility bills can be paid by cash or cheque at the Village Office or at the ATB Financial branch in the General Store.

The reason you can't pay your bill online or at any other bank is that they charge quite a lot for the service. With only 100 customers, we can't justify the expense.
