

Please read these standards!

GLADIOLI & DAHLIAS... May be exhibited as perennials.

Use cotton or wooden pegs to keep stem straight.

Dahlia heads should not hang over.

ROSES... Leave some foliage on stems. Remove wilted flowers and petals. No dust or sprays should show.

PETUNIA, PANSY, VIOLA... Try a shallow container such as a margarine tub. Cut a hole in the lid, then use the lid to hold down a piece of tin foil. No spills!

No foliage is necessary.

SWEET PEA, MARIGOLD, SNAPDRAGON... Do not crowd exhibit. One color is best but mixed colors are allowed. Trim out dead flowers.

ARRANGEMENTS... 1 1/2 times the height or width of the container is a good guide. Opaque containers are better to cover stems. Flowers should appear fresh and foliage will add interest. Do not use weeds. A bouquet is not an arrangement. It is a collection of flowers in a vase but doesn't form a design.

CUCUMBER, SQUASH... Leave 1/2 in. stem. Should be firm, no soft spots. Cukes should not taper much at blossom end. Should be clean.

FRUIT, TOMATOES... Should be uniform examples of their varieties, good size for their varieties.

POTATOES... Should be smooth and as uniform as possible, should not show signs of disease.

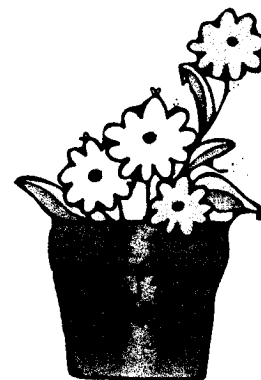
ALL SPECIMENS... Name varieties where known, for example, Warba potatoes, Peace roses, Roma tomatoes. This is educational to the public and will give your entry a higher standard.

There is a limit of one entry per person per class.

All entries must be in by 11:00 a.m.

Judging is done by accredited judges supplied by the Alberta Horticultural Association.
